Ouestion One includes the following improvements:

Build a new Career and Technical Education (CTE) addition, including science classrooms, at our secondary school.

Reconfigure the administrative offices at our secondary school to provide additional specialist space.

additional Build specialist and classrooms space at our elementary.

Construct a new +/-120-stall parking lot at our elementary school.

Improve the functionality of the Media Center at our secondary school.

Upgrade the locker rooms at our secondary school to improve shower facilities, lockers, benches, and meet storm shelter requirements.

Complete various improvements to the existing theater area.

Renovate the restrooms adjacent to the student dining area in our elementary school.

Ouestion Two, which is contingent on the passage of Ouestion One, includes the following improvements:

Construct two additions for performing arts at the secondary school.

Build a new stadium, (Continued on page 10)

including a football field and track, bleachers, a press box, and appropriate lighting on the west end of the secondary school site.

Rebuild the varsity and junior varsity softball fields with an additional field in a pinwheel configuration.

· Construct new con-

cessions buildings at both sites.

• Construct a new concrete pad for portable toilets for activities.

• Expand the event restrooms at the secondary school.

• Construct a new +/170-stall parking lot at our

secondary school to expand our bus drop-off and pick-up loop, and provide additional event parking.

• Add additional square footage to the CTE addition included in Q1, including spaces to support agricultural science growth labs.

If approved, the district would invest \$27.95 million into addressing these needs. If both questions are approved, the estimated tax impact on a \$170,600 residential home in the district would be approximately \$25 per month starting in 2024.
